Introducing Examiner Mentors

In January, the Society introduces a new Examiner Mentor designation – senior Examiners appointed by the Society to mentor examiner candidates through their apprenticeship and to decide if the candidate is ready for certification as an Examiner.

Examiner Mentors will:

- Provide effective apprenticeship experiences for examiner candidates including evaluation of their performance and guidance on their professional development as potential Lifesaving Society Examiners.
- Assist in the identification, recruitment and development of potential Lifesaving Society Examiners.
- Act as expert resources to Lifesaving Society apprenticing examiner candidates in matters related to Lifesaving Society evaluation standards.

Experienced Examiners who wish to become an Examiner Mentor must:

- Hold a current Examiner certification and have examining experience (i.e., at least 3 exams) in the stream(s) in which they wish to mentor apprenticing examiners.
- Apply to the Lifesaving Society office with a letter of recommendation.

Certification as a Lifesaving Society Trainer is desirable.

Christine Ryan – World Finalist

Christine Ryan (Parlee Beach Lifesaving Club) finished 5th in the 90 m Beach Sprint – Canada's highest place finish in the National Team competition (Open category) at the Lifesaving World Championships in Adelaide, Australia. Christine was among the 7,000 participants from 45 nations at the event.

"I'm satisfied with my results," Ryan said after her race. "The competition here is crazy; the women are really fast. It's inspiring."

Christine qualified for the Beach Flags B-final (finishing 14th) and anchored the Oceanwomen Relay to an 8th place finish.

"I really enjoyed experiencing the National Teams competition. Now I know the level of competition and what needs to be done. I'm looking forward to getting back to training for the [2020 championships](#) in Italy."
