
Society releases safety standards for public pools

The Lifesaving Society has defined the minimum requirements for the safe operation of public swimming pools with the publication of its *New Brunswick Public Pool Safety Standards*. Consistent with its public service mandate and drowning prevention mission, the Lifesaving Society is providing New Brunswick's public pool operators with authoritative guidance on best practices for patron safety.

New Brunswick Public Pool Safety Standards was developed in collaboration with New Brunswick public pool operators and experienced aquatic leadership personnel who researched pool safety standards across various North American jurisdictions.

"This was a demanding project," says Society President Stephen Hanlon. "The leaders of multiple aquatic facilities from across the province worked through many drafts to define the standards for our public pools. Their hard work and professional commitment to public safety is evident on every page of the New Brunswick Public Pool Safety Standards."

Leadership Training: What's new for Affiliates?

The Society has revised its leadership training system zeroing in on the competencies needed to provide quality lifesaving education to Canadians in the 21st century. The result is a multi-level, competency-based system designed to encourage and support the development of progressively skilled and knowledgeable Lifesaving Society instructors — at all levels.

Key changes

- New (as of January 1, 2018): Assistant Instructor, Swim Instructor, Lifesaving Instructor, First Aid Instructor, National Lifeguard Instructor, Examiner, Trainer, National Trainer.
- Retired (as of January 1, 2019): Advanced Instructor, CPR-HCP Instructor, Airway Management Instructor, Boat Rescue Instructor, Distinction Examiner, Core Instructor clinic, Examination Standards clinic, Instructor Trainer clinic.

Leadership implementation plan

Affiliates may transition to the new leadership courses anytime between January 1, 2018 and January 1, 2019. We are updating our Trainers and completing the support materials they need. Only Trainers who have attended the Lifesaving Society Trainer Update Clinic may teach the new leadership courses. Consult the Society's Find a Member service to confirm that a Trainer has been updated.
