# New Brunswick adopts CSA for Workplace Standard First Aid

As of January 12, 2024, the Government of New Brunswick adopted the **CSA standards Z1210-17 First aid training for the workplace**. First Aid providers, including the Society, are currently in the process of reviewing their Workplace Standard First Aid program to identify any required changes.

Lifesaving Society First Aid Instructors, Examiners and Trainers can anticipate more information, as well as a **First Aid Update Clinic** later this year. For the time being, instructors and examiners should continue to teach and evaluate the existing Workplace Standard First Aid curriculum using the current editions of the *Canadian First Aid Manual* and *First Aid Award Guide*.

Candidates need only attend one of the three options:

- 1. April 23 and 25, 6–9:00 p.m.
- 2. June 12 and 13, 6–9:00 p.m.
- 3. August 11, all day
